#### Vear 1 and 2

In Maths, the children in Year 1 have been finishing their unit on Shape. We have been investigating 2D and 3D shapes. We have looked at how we know if it is a 2D or a 3D shape, we have named the shapes, and we counted their sides, faces and vertices.

In English, the whole of KS1 has been busy investigating some strange things that have been happening around school. First, the teachers received an email to say a dinosaur had been spotted on the CCTV cameras! We went to investigate and collect some evidence. We noticed lots of unusual things, like cracks in the floor, bushes were



flattened, and we even saw some footprints in the mud! We are now writing all this up as a newspaper report.

In Science, we have been investigating materials, and we made some salt dough. We investigated the properties of the ingredients on their own and again after we mixed them together. We have looked at the decorations we made to see if the material has changed.

This week, the children have been busy practicing their songs for the Christmas Concert. They are very excited to perform them for their families.
