A message from the Principal



Wow! What a fantastic start to the year it has been! We are all loving the positive energy, dedication and focus to the learning that we are seeing from the children in school. We have welcomed a number of visitors into school in recent weeks and they have all commented on how amazing our children behave, listen and show respect – all of which we have been working on. One of the highlights of the last few weeks has to be our visit from Leon Baptiste, Rio Mitcham and Chris Tawiah. Our children were inspired by their successes but also how they shared they had overcome adversity. We are constantly telling our children they go to the best school in the world but it is only the best school because we have the best children, staff and families! I love coming to school and thank you to everyone in the school community for your positivity.

Attendance

For the first two weeks of term our school attendance was above the National average and was really positive. However, our whole school attendance for the last 7 days was just **94.1%** which is some way below our target of **97%**. In the last week, we have also seen an increasing percentage of children who have been late.

Ultimately, reduced attendance and repeated lateness will have a detrimental impact on a child's education so we ask for your support in ensuring your child attends school regularly. Each week in assembly we will be celebrating the top three classes with the highest attendance and the winner will get to look after our attendance mascot for the week. Wow! What a fantastic start to the school year we have had. The children in Saplings Class have absolutely blown me away with how well they have settled into life at Newton Road School. In the first couple of weeks, we have prioritised learning the Newton Road way; sitting on the carpet in a strong gorilla position, lining up like strong penguins, using our magnet eyes and practising the stop signal. In addition to this, it has been lovely to see the children of Saplings Class come together as one, and begin to develop friendships with others in the class and explore their environment. We have dived straight in with phonics and your children have already learnt some of the single letter sounds. This will continue throughout the term. Years One and Two

What a fantastic start to the year we have had! It has have been a fantastic start and we have been working really hard and demonstrating our school values and recalling 'The Newton Road Way'. We have also been having great fun in our writing lessons over the last two weeks. We have looked at two traditional tales: The Gingerbread Man and Goldilocks and the Three Bears. Our children have enjoyed getting into character with role-play and adding expression to their story retelling. They were brilliant at it and it was lovely to see their enthusiasm.

As staff we have loved getting to know our children and we are incredibly proud that our children are regularly praised for being great role models to the rest of the school. Our children have enjoyed our Stone Age theme which included a visit to a Stone Age camp. This has helped inspire them in their writing and with their understanding in history. In reading, children have been exploring Fantastic Mr Fox with a focus on their fluency of the text which they are doing great at! It has been a fantastic few weeks and it looks set to be a great year with them.

Oak, Ash and Beech have made an amazing start to life in Year 5/6. They have really embraced our high expectations and strive to be the best they can be every day. Classes have really enjoyed beginning to learn about Ancient Egypt and some of its unusual practices – particularly Mummification! Coram Beanstalk



Can you spare a few hours a week to become a reading helper at our school?

We are working with a charity called Coram Beanstalk to recruit and train volunteer reading helpers who can commit to an afternoon a week to come in to school. As a reading helper you will support at least 3 children on a one to one basis outside of the classroom environment. It's a fun role that's about much more than just listening to children read.

As a reading helper you will support children to become readers; helping children to switch onto reading, learn to read and become confident independent readers. You will be trained in a proven approach and will lead sessions for each child that bring fun and enjoyment to the reading experience, ultimately wanting the child to choose to read and be enthusiastic about it!

Reading helpers read to the child, talk about what they have read, check understanding and encourage thinking and conversation based on a book. They use fun book based activities to reinforce understanding, develop vocabulary and further cement enjoyment through a positive reading experience. We know this approach works and raises reading attainment, with one to one sessions bringing additional benefits of improving confidence, self-esteem and attitude to learning.

If you would like to become a reading helper at our school, or you know someone, perhaps a grandparent or a neighbour who would like to join our friendly school community please do consider this role.
